#### **Fees Letter**

I hope you saw our letter emailed to you on 5 July, if not, it is here again for you....

Dear Parents.

As you know, providing the best possible environment for your children is our top priority. We value your support in achieving our aims and ambitions to nurture and develop your children.

It also important to us to ensure that we provide an excellent service at the appropriate level of cost and in reviewing our fees for the forthcoming academic year, we have come to the difficult decision that we must increase these fees with effect from September 2024. Taking into account the significant increases in our operating costs and rising salaries we know that our fees need to increase in line with those changes so that we can continue to provide high-quality education and care to your children and fairly reward our talented and dedicated staff. I attach a copy of the new fee structure alongside this email which represents less than 5% average increase on last year's fees.

We recognise that despite slowing inflation the cost of living remains a challenge for many and therefore we understand that an increase in fees might be difficult for some families. If these increases result in significant financial difficulties for you then please do come and speak with us.

We appreciate your understanding and support as we move forward with this change. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to reach out to us. We value your feedback and look forward to continuing to work with you and your family.

Finally, we can confirm that, as we are a Nursery School, we are exempt from any plans to add VAT to such fees should Labour's plans for Independent School fees come to fruition.

# Reminder: deadline for working family eligibility code applications (including for 9 months to 23 month olds)

The autumn term deadline for working parents to apply for their eligibility codes for both the existing 30 hour entitlement for 3 and 4 year olds, working family entitlement for 2 year olds (15 hours) and the new working family entitlement for 9 months to 23 month olds (15 hours) is **31 August 2024.** Start dates of eligibility codes must be on or prior to this date for the autumn term funding.

#### Existing eligibility codes requiring action

Please check your eligibility codes for 30 hours funding and working family codes for 2 year olds. If any of the validity end dates have passed, please re-validate your eligibility code via your childcare accounts on the .gov.uk website by the end of August. If you do not re-check your eligibility successfully and the grace period end date has expired before the start of the autumn term, the codes will no longer be valid, and we will not be able to apply your funding.
